Solidarity message delivered by the reigning Child Sanitation Diplomat, Adjoa Gyakoa Appiah-Kubi, at the 34th Edition of the Annual Mole WASH Conference Series held at Jirapa in the Upper West Region on Monday, 30th October 2023, on behalf of Ghanaian Children

Good morning, Mr. Chairman, distinguished guests, ladies, and gentlemen, I bring you greetings from the children of Ghana and I believe that they are very happy, wherever they are, that organisers of the Mole Water and Sanitation Conference have once again remembered them by giving them the platform to make their voice heard. I am also personally very glad to be selected to represent all of them here at Jirapa.

I am glad to observe that tomorrow, God-willing, I will be interacting with children on sanitation and hygiene at this venue as part of the Mole Conference, the first of its kind in the 34-year history of this conference. We are so grateful for this gesture, CONIWAS.

Mr. Chairman, I hope that even beyond the Mole Conference, stakeholders in the sector will continue to create more space and opportunities for children to learn and possibly share their views. I also wish that in addition to the Child Sanitation Diplomat initiative, there will be other child-centered innovations to provide more opportunities for children to learn and contribute to creating the world that we want. As a sanitation campaigner, I also promise to avail myself whenever possible, to support efforts to advocate for change and to sensitize the masses.
